Reporting and recording crimes

Durham Police. The page contains emails, forms and other methods of reporting crimes or incidents. If you want to report a non-emergency situation, such as theft or damage, you should either call 101 to speak to the local police, or go to your nearest police station to report the situation (in Durham City, the local police station is on New Elvet). In an emergency, always call 999.
